

Notice under the Engineering and Geoscientific Professions Act

This Notice is provided in accordance with Section 36.2(1) of *The Engineering and Geoscientific Professions Act*.

This is Notice that on June 1, 2026, a professional member was formally cautioned by the Association's Investigation Committee.

The Formal Caution relates to the member's involvement in issuing a Site Review Summary for a private residence in Winnipeg, Manitoba.

Specifically, the Committee determined that the member made statements on engineering matters without sufficient substantiation and presented information in a manner which lacked professional judgement. As a result, the Committee determined that the member demonstrated a lack of knowledge or lack of skill or judgment in the practice of professional engineering in violation of s. 46(1)(d) and (e) of the *Engineering and Geoscientific Professions Act*.

Furthermore, the Committee found that the confrontational language and approach used by the member detracted from the substance of the report and risked undermining constructive dialogue and collaboration among interest holders. The Committee determined that the member's conduct was inconsistent with Canon 5 of the *Code of Ethics*, which requires that practitioners "treat clients, colleagues, and others with equity, fairness, courtesy, and good faith, give credit where it is due, and accept, as well as give, honest and fair professional criticism."
