INVESTIGATION COMMITTEE

The Investigation Committee reviews complaints made about the conduct of members in a timely manner and makes recommendations for discipline based on the severity of the offense. The Investigation Committee is a committee of Council and is made up of registered professionals from all engineering and geoscience disciplines.

General Duties and Responsibilities:

As a member of the Investigation Committee, you will assist in the review, consideration and decision making of complaints against a member. You will also provide guidance to membership on standards of professional practice.

Specific Skills and Qualifications

- Be a Professional Geoscientist (P.Geo.)
- Have knowledge of the Act and By-laws
- Some knowledge of the judicial process
- Be available for meetings
- Provide input to the committee

Time Commitment:

The committee meets monthly, with meeting times set by the committee chair. Additional time will also be needed by committee members to review files prior to meetings. Subcommittees may also be formed, which may require additional meetings. Committee members are appointed for two-year terms, renewable for up to four consecutive terms.
